



ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY CONSOLIDATED PLAN FOR HOUSING & COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Anne Arundel County receives annual funding from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for housing and community development activities from four sources:

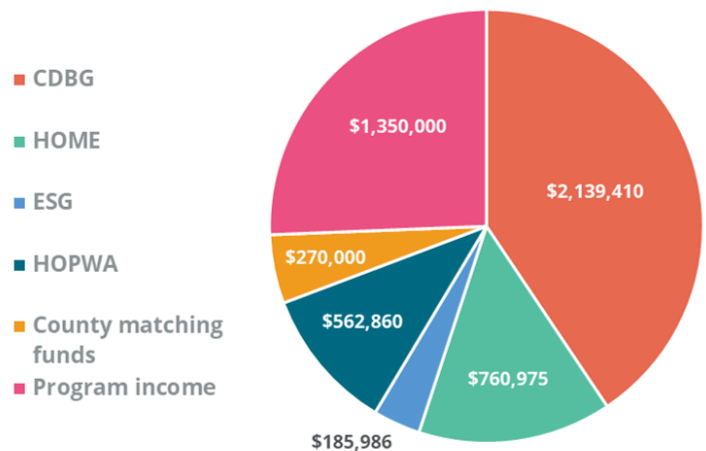
- Community Development Block Grant (**CDBG**);
- HOME Investment Partnerships (**HOME**);
- Emergency Solutions Grant (**ESG**); and
- Housing Opportunities for People with HIV/AIDS (**HOPWA**).

This funding also generates matching funds and program income. The funding must benefit low- and moderate-income residents. To receive these funds, the County must submit a report to HUD called a Consolidated Plan every five years. The next plan is due in June 2025 and Arundel Community Development Services (ACDS) is currently updating the county's Consolidated Plan. Funding must benefit low- and moderate-income residents. The program funding is supplemented with matching funds and program income.

What is a Consolidated Plan?

A Consolidated Plan is a 5-year planning document required by HUD. It uses a combination of data and community outreach to determine the top housing needs, community development concerns, and gaps in supportive services for low- and moderate-income populations in the county. It guides the investment of federal, state, and local housing and community development resources.

What does this funding support?

Examples of eligible projects:

- Homeownership counseling and mortgage assistance
- Financial literacy and rental assistance
- Foreclosure and eviction prevention
- Homeowner and rental unit rehabilitation
- Construction of affordable rentals
- Homeless prevention and housing
- Youth recreation (limited to 15% of CDBG funding)
- Supportive services (limited to 15% of CDBG funding)
